

## **Methods of using information technology in learning English**

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In the modern world, a person cannot imagine life without a computer, Internet, telephone, TV. Nowadays they play a huge role. For example: with the help of a computer and the Internet, we can watch movies, play games, listen to music, get acquainted and communicate, being with this person at different distances. Also, the Internet can help us in answering any question.

Information technology - a wide class of disciplines and areas of activity related to technologies for control and data processing, including the use of computer technology. The purpose of information technology is to obtain the necessary information for the user and to take any human action.

Nowadays, it is difficult to imagine life without the Internet. Since he serves us not only as entertainment, but also as an assistant.

Now let's look at how a person can use the Internet in their studies.

Search for information: If you are asked to write an essay on a specific topic, to write it, you need to know as much information about the topic as possible.

Communication: If you want to learn a foreign language, you can watch different words, videos, rules on the Internet. But when talking to native speakers of this language, you may not understand what they mean. Therefore, you can use the chat, where you can communicate with a native speaker and learn how to pronounce words.

Discussion: When you see an interesting article on the Internet, you can discuss it with someone, tell your point of view, or listen to the opinion of another.

Online meetings or conferences: They are held when there is no opportunity to meet in person, and they are used for any negotiations or discussions of something. For example: a decree has come from the chief sanitary doctor that in your country a large number of people are sick and an urgent quarantine is needed. It means closing all schools, etc. But for people to continue to gain knowledge, something must be done. But we must not forget that the Internet is just an auxiliary means of learning, and in order to gain certain knowledge, it must be correctly entered into your process.

Nowadays, there are many methods in learning English. Since English is very popular, and in most schools it was introduced as a compulsory language. Few can afford to attend some courses, and the school has a shortage of hours. Therefore, a lot of different methods have appeared on the Internet on how to easily and quickly learn it.

The most popular methods are:

Schechter's method: This method is to forget about grammar and focus entirely on communication. That is, when we learned to speak our native language, no one explained to us any rules of constructions, cases and parts of speech, but simply communicated.

**Pros:** A person begins to communicate immediately, overcoming the language barrier and is not afraid to seem misunderstood. And also this method teaches you to immediately formulate phrases.

**Minuses:** At the moment, method is not relevant, since a lot of different video lessons have already appeared on the Internet and current textbooks provide a variety of grammatical material.

It is worth trying this method, especially for those who have a language barrier and start communicating in English faster.

**Pimsler's method:** The entire lesson takes place in the form of speaking and listening, which lasts no more than 30 minutes. You cannot write words, read or look them up in a dictionary.

**Benefits:** In this method, you learn how to use words in phrases and sentences in any situation.

**Disadvantages:** When memorizing ready-made phrases, there may be a problem in application. I think this method is suitable for those people who do not have time to study. And here the lesson lasts only 30 minutes, especially since you can listen to it anywhere. And the audio is recorded by native speakers so you can immediately learn how to speak correctly.

**Dragunkin's method:** Basically this method is based on grammar. It contains transcriptions in both English and Russian.

**Pros:** There is a constant comparison with the Russian language, which greatly facilitates the perception of the language

**Minuses:** Pronunciation will differ with native speakers, and errors are allowed.

This method is very interesting and useful. This method is especially suitable for those who have never studied English. But for those who have an intermediate level, they may not like the way the transcription is written.

**Petrov's method:** The methodology involves 16 hours of intensive training, after which you will be able to speak in English.

**Pros:** Create a friendly atmosphere where the teacher explains everything in simple language.

**Minuses:** Very little vocabulary, and the explanations are all superficial.

If you have not studied English, then this method will help you take the first step towards learning.

The techniques which are described above in learning English can help you learn English on your own, but up to a certain level. To learn English perfectly, you need not only to understand text and speech by ear, but also to have conversational skills. It is also impossible to determine how correctly you pronounce the words, for this you need an interlocutor with whom you can talk or explain some incomprehensible points.

I believe that such methods are worth trying, they do not take much time and when you watch or listen to them, it's up to you. But the most important thing is desire, if there is one, then you can quickly and easily learn or improve your language.
